Public transport:

By plane:

From **Tegel** airport: take Bus 109 to Adenauerplatz/Kurfürstendamm. Change there to Bus M19 (leaving from the opposite side of the street). Take bus marked 'S-Bhf Grunewald' or 'Hagenplatz' and get off at 'Hagenplatz' Taubertstraße'. There turn left, the second street on the right will be *Bismarckallee*.

From **Schönefeld** airport: <u>either</u> take fast train S9 (direction 'S Spandau DB') to 'Westkreuz'; change to fast train S7 (direction 'Wannsee') to 'S Grunewald' and continue with bus line M19 (direction U Mehringdamm') to 'Taubertstraße'. (75 min.)

or take S 45 (direction 'S+U Gesundbrunnen') to 'S Halensee' and change to bus M19 (direction 'S Grunewald/Hagenplatz') to 'Taubertstraße". (65 min.)

From **Tempelhof** airport: take Bus 104 marked' Neu-Westend' and get off at 'Rathenauplatz, change there to Bus M19' and follow the directions as above.

By train:

From Central Station 'Hauptbahnhof - Lehrter Bahnhof':

take fast train S7 (direction 'Wannsee-Bhf' or ,Potsdam-Hbf') to S ,Grunewald'or S9 or S75 or S5 (direction 'S Spandau DB') to 'Westkreuz'; change to fast train S7 (direction 'Wannsee') to 'S Grunewald' and continue with bus line M19 (direction U Mehringdamm') to 'Taubertstraße'. (25 min.)

From 'Zoologischer Garten' railway station:

either take fast train S9 or S75 or S5 (direction 'S Spandau DB') to 'Westkreuz'; change to fast train S7 (direction 'Wannsee') to 'S Grunewald' and continue with bus line M19 (direction U Mehringdamm') to 'Taubertstraße'.

or take bus 109 (direction 'Flughafen Tegel') to 'U Adenauerplatz' and continue with bus M19 (direction 'S Grunewald/Hagenplatz') to 'Taubertstraße''. (20 min.)

From 'Lichtenberg' oder 'Ostbahnhof' railway station:

take fast train S9 or S75 or S5 (direction 'S Spandau DB') to 'Westkreuz'; change to fast train S7 (direction 'Wannsee') to 'S Grunewald' and follow the directions as above.

From 'Wannsee' S-Bahn station:

take S7 in the direction of 'Westkreuz', get off at 'Grunewald' station and continue with bus M19 (direction 'U Mehringdamm') to 'Taubertstraße'. (15 min.)

By train (from easterly direction):

From 'Lichtenberg' railway station: take the S-Bahn (line S75) in the direction of 'Spandau Bhf'; change to train S7 (direction 'Wannsee') to 'S Grunewald'. Get off at 'Grunewald' station and follow the directions as above.

By train (from westerly direction):

From 'Zoologischer Garten' railway station: either take

S-Bahn (line 7 direction Wannsee DB) and get off at 'Grunewald' station or walk to Kurfürstendamm (about 400 m) and take Bus M19 at the streetcorner of Kurfürstendamm and Joachimstaler Straße and follow the directions as above

From 'Wannsee' S-Bahn station: take S-Bahn (line S7) in the direction of 'Ahrensfelde', get off at 'Grunewald' station and follow the directions as above.

By car:

From Hannover or Nürnberg:take exit 'Berlin/Zentrum' on the 'Berliner Ring'. Carry on to exit 'Hüttenweg', turn right and go straight ahead until the first traffic lights, turn left there and follow the road straight ahead until you get to 'Hagenplatz'. Approx. 300 m after the first traffic lights turn right into Bismarckallee. It is the second building on the right.

From **Hamburg:** take exit A 111 in the direction of 'Zentrum/Charlottenburg'. Go past the congress centre (ICC) and turn right into A 115 in the direction of 'Hannover/Nürnberg', exit 'Hüttenweg', and there turn left and carry on as stated above.

From Frankfurt/Oder or Dresden: drive along 'Berliner Ring' in the direction of 'Magdeburg/Hannover' up to the motorway merging point 'Nuthetal'. Turn right into A 115, and at the next traffic lights turn left and go straight ahead to 'Hagenplatz'. Carry on as stated above.
